

## **XP Corner: Designated Funds**

The largest amount of funds most churches receive are called "Undesignated Giving" or "General Fund Giving." These gifts are used toward the general operating budget of the church. These have no giver restrictions on how to fund a very specific cause.

The other category is called "Designated Giving." The donor restricts exactly what he or she wants done with the money. Most churches (ours included) have real challenges that are tied to Designated Giving. These churches are often not equipped to handle situations like the following:

- 1. Designated Giving can sometimes be a protest of (or a way around) the approved budget of the church. These are often high on the giver's list of priorities but aren't sufficiently high on the church's priorities list to merit sufficient funding via the budget.
- 2. Designated Giving can sometimes be illegal. Let's say the donor gives to a scholarship fund, and (surprise!) his son receives the funds for his college education a year later.
- 3. Designated Giving potentially creates divisions in the church when a giver is doing things his way or her way, in support of a "pet project".
- 4. Designated Giving creates an environment where advocates of a particular ministry must solicit restricted funds. Ministries are intended to minister, not to be fundraisers.
- 5. Designated Giving sometimes comes with stipulations that are difficult or impossible to comply with. What happens, for example, if a designated gift is given to build a Family Life Center, and the church decides that it does not want one? (Hmm, does this sound familiar?)
- 6. Designated Giving often hurts the budget giving of the church. In many cases, each dollar that is designated is also a dollar not contributed to the overall budget.

The best way to support a ministry of the church is by faithful giving to the General Fund. Only then can the church prioritize how it does ministry and how unrestricted (undesignated) gifts are spent.

To be clear, there is most definitely a place in our church for Designated Giving. On the other hand, our church has some 57 different active Designated Funds – Heinz 57. Way too many! Many of these were created for purposes that no longer exist. Others are unnecessary duplications of a budget line in the church budget that perhaps is not funded sufficiently. Still others have seen no in/out activity in several years.

Over the course of the next several months you will not only see a reduction in the number of active Designated Funds that we have but also a decided shift towards making our church budget central to how all ministries are prioritized (or not) and then funded (or not) by our General Fund. The shift will not happen overnight. But it will be done prudently and methodically over the next 12 months. In the shorter term, a big part of this effort will be to identify those very few funds that we should continue to be funded via Designated Giving. In the longer term the need for Designated Giving will lessen significantly as we prioritize better and fund fully our budget needs.





Lottie Moon was appointed a missionary to China July 7, She was a bold woman of action and radical obedience who shared Christ with the people of China to the end. Lottie died December 24, 1912, leaving a legacy of love and service to her Lord. In truth, she was a disciple of Christ, and she left everything in order to follow her Savior. Her influence led to the establishment of Woman's Missionary Union and inspired other missions' pioneers to join her on the field. Her passionate letter-writing led to the offering that bears her name today, Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. Lottie's life is a reminder of why we must give to send and support missionaries serving among unreached people in unreached places. Today, when aifts aren't growing as quickly as the number of workers God is calling to the mission field, Lottie's call for sacrificial giving rings with more urgency than ever.

#### ALL CHURCHES GROW OLD. STRATEGIC CHURCHES GROW YOUNG


Lately, I have been reading Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies To Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church. It has been stretching my heart and my mind with the love of Jesus for our young people and their families. Here are a few things I highlighted as I read this thought-provoking book:

- Churches that grow young sometimes actually program less in order to free up more space/time for relational connection.
- Warm is the new cool. More than flashy worship, young people want authenticity and connection. Honest relationships and the ability to be real or authentic are not only preferences for young people; they also build stronger churches.
- Parents still carry the most important weight in their kids' faith development. This is true not only in childhood but also through adolescence. Research continues to affirm that the best predictor of a young person's faith is the faith of their parents. Ministry leaders who care about kids also must include the care, equipping, and formation of parents and families.
- Young people need load-bearing roles in the community, meaning they contribute through serving and using their gifts.
- Young people want to know not only what they are saved from but also what they are saved for. They want to take action, not just hear about what they can't do.Participation and challenge are two central features of churches growing young.

I have been challenged by this book as we travel this faith journey together to grow our church younger here in Virginia Beach. As we take Jesus' message seriously to let the children come to Him, may we find creative ways to grow our church Younger.


