Go outside our church and look at our facilities through the eyes of a person who is deciding whether to check us out. What do you see? Do you see paint peeling, mildew on the walls, messy landscaping, a front sign in disrepair and fading, potholes in the parking lot, fingerprints on the doors and windows.


Now walk inside and look through the eyes of that same person. Do you see walls that need washing or painting? Do the restrooms look and smell clean? What about the carpets and floors? Check out several spaces. Do these draw you in or do they repel you?

It's a fact—we only get one chance to make a first impression. For us, a church that wants to reach more people with the gospel of Jesus Christ, the first impression we project is critical. Not just for attracting people but also for holding them.

We're talking about first impressions of our facilities. While I know that people should come to church for the right reasons, never forget that unbelievers are going to act like unbelievers. Many are not coming for the right reasons. But they have eyes. Some will have a critical eye for quality; others will have eyes for aesthetic excellence. Their first impression will likely determine if they ever make it past the front doors and get a chance to hear the gospel or if they decide to ever come back.

Now that you've checked us over closely, take another step. We are in constant need of volunteers to clean, paint, and handle small renovations on a regular and consistent basis. We have way more work to do here than is possible for our one-person facilities staff to do. Make great first impressions part of your own ministry. Better yet, put a team together and create a group ministry along these lines. Give one day of your time each month (or each quarter) just to make our church's first impression better? Why not?

A good first impression doesn't need to cost a lot of time and money. Even if it does, remember that the cost of not making a good first impression is generally much greater.

### John 3:8

The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.

Just to remind us of the context here, Jesus says these words while talking with Nicodemus. This is just after the verse where Jesus says, "You must be born again;" and just few verses before, "For God so loved the world that..."

As I prepared this article, I thought of these verses. They came to mind because a lot of things happen each week behind the scenes —unseen, like the wind—to make each worship service, special program and concert possible. Each week TLBC members give their time and talents to the Lord and to His church. Here are just a few of many examples of what regularly whooshes through your church:

- 1.many climb ladders and pull necessary digital cables around the sanctuary...
- 2.many organize flower orders and delivery, arrange them on the platform, carefully choose and display banners throughout the campus and decorate the Sanctuary for seasonal worship—most especially for Advent and Holy Week...
- 3. several push the church's 1060 lbs. personal lift into the sanctuary, set it up and move it all around to replace the burnt-out bulbs, often 30+ feet in the air...
- 4.a few crawls under the platform to trace and repair audio
- 5.many clear the entire platform, including the 750 lbs. grand piano, to make room for a program or concert—then reset it all before the next worship service occurs...
- 6. several spend hundreds of hours (truly not an exaggeration) reading manuals and watching training videos to learn how to operate the sundry software programs and equipment essential to so much of what happens on a normal Sunday morning...

This is list is not comprehensive. So why do they do it? I believe they serve quietly, invisibly—like the wind Jesus spoke about—with the hope that a more impactful display of wind will come, a wind like that of Acts 2:1-2:

...the day of Pentecost came...suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind

came from heaven and filled the whole house...and tongues of fire separated and came to rest on each of them.
