From the Pastor's Desk

Please note that I plan on teaching a master class in the Fellowship Hall on September 29 and October 6 on the biblical basis for Elders in Baptist Churches. During that time, I plan to:

- Explain the difference between the Presbyterian model of being Elder-ruled and the Congregational model of being Elder-led.
- Explain why many Baptist Churches are returning to an Elder-led model.
- Point out the essential nature of Elder-led churches in the New Testament.
- Review the difference between Elders and Deacons.
- Examine the qualifications of Elders.
- Show the New Testament duties of Elders.
- Explain what our church must do to install and operate with Elders.
- Give a proposed timeline for establishing Elders.
- Explain how this will help our church in the future.

Please make every effort to be there for these two classes. They will be held at the normal Discipleship Group times. There will be time for classes to take care of prayer requests and other necessary actions, as well. Who knows, you might even see someone you haven't seen for some time because they are attending the other service.





In my office, on the left, front corner wall as I sit at my desk, is the sign in the picture. I have had it hanging in my office for about five years now. It has three parts to it that encourage (challenge) me with my spiritual walk every day I'm in my office.

"Love is spoken here" makes me think of I Thessalonians 5 beginning with verse 11: Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. It is my hope that we are encouraging each other with our words every day! Sometimes, in the busyness of life and ministry, I can be abrupt and less than encouraging but I strive to be a person who can say "love is spoken here."

"Joy is chosen here" reminds me of verse 16: Rejoice always. Joy is a choice we make as we face our daily challenges—and some of those challenges are very difficult, which is why Paul follows the command to rejoice with his instruction to pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances. When I look at the sign on my wall, it helps me to rejoice, pray and give thanks—essentials when choosing joy.

Finally, the sign reminds me that "Grace is given here." Verse 15 says: Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. These are great instructions but sometimes hard to do without Jesus' grace. Paul blesses us with that grace in verse 28: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. A nice sign is great office décor but without God's grace, it is empty of true meaning. This August, may you find your home, your church and your community to be ones where love is spoken, joy is chosen and grace is given. Amen!

Financial stewardship is very biblical. A church budget is an important tool. Not just because it helps the church to know where money is being allocated, but also because churches are called to be good stewards of what God has given them. And while the Bible does not specifically address how churches and their leaders are to build a church budget, it does have much to say about money and how to live as wise and Godly stewards.

Counting the Cost. In Luke 14:28-30 (ESV), Jesus says, "For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it beain to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.'" This verse shows the importance of a budget as a tool that helps churches to know whether they can complete the work they have before them. Budgets help churches to know not just where God's money is going, but also how much money they have on hand for its different ministries. Counting the cost keeps churches from overextending themselves financially before the foundation is laid.

Prioritizing the work of the Ministry. The book of Proverbs is full of much wisdom concerning money and its uses, but one proverb that is helpful for church leaders crafting a budget is Proverbs 22:7 (ESV) which says, "The rich rules over the poor, but the borrower is the slave of the lender." This proverb is a good reminder to budget in consonance with the church ministry calling. A church that budgets poorly will generally find itself in dire need of financial resources and thus be placed at the whim of members who feel what they contribute financially gives them a larger say in how the church should conduct its business. Or a church may over-extend itself by focusing on less important things at the expense of what is most important to the ministry and life of the church. A church that "majors on the minors" is not being obedient to its either its ministry or to God's calling. This proverb is both encouragement and warning to budget prayerfully so that the church may be freed up to do the work God has called it to.

August marks the start of our annual church budget planning cycle. Pray that we will do this prayerfully as we consider our ministry goals and needs for 2025 and also continue being good stewards of God's money in 2024.


